Forest of Reading® Festival



The Forest of Reading Festival was back in person in Toronto for the first time since 2019. The OLA welcomed almost 4,000 young people to Harbourfront Centre on May 16-17, and over 200 volunteers, nominees, publishing partners, and guests joined to deliver this fantastic event. Awards were given in person for the Silver Birch Express, Silver Birch Fiction, Red Maple, and White Pine.

In addition, the Forest of Reading created digital ceremonies inhouse for the Blue Spruce, Yellow Cedar and Peuplier Awards for the first time. After cancelling the French Festival, we added the Mélèze and Tamarac awards to the digital experience. Ainara Alleyne and comedian Ali Hassan hosted the in-person and digital ceremonies. As of June 1st, the ceremonies have been viewed by over 1,500 classes.

The Library Marketplace launched a new line of merchandise for the Forest of Reading and it was a huge success, especially at the store at the Festival. <u>Visit The Library Marketplace to see more!</u>

UN PROGRAMME BILINGUE PANCANADIEN




Prix Tamarac 2023
