






2023 Forest of Reading[®] Evergreen Award[™] Winner Announced Alongside the 2024 Nominated Titles

"Change is a constant in life and there is no question that we are living in a time of dramatic change," said Enid Wray and Julie Wendland, Co-Chairs of the Evergreen Award Selection Committee. "Each of the titles chosen this year mines the deeply personal - whether via fiction or non-fiction - addressing the impact of change and how we adapt to that change. In exploring change, these titles bring together the local and the global, and focus on the resilience we have within ourselves, our families, our friendship groups, and our communities."

The Evergreen Award program is a perfect way for public libraries and book clubs to engage with best titles in Canadian fiction and non-fiction. It is one of ten programs that form the OLA's Forest of Reading, Canada's largest recreational reading program of its kind with over 270,000 Canadians participating each year.

A committee of library professionals chooses the nominated titles for the Evergreen Award. Readers can submit their votes for the award during September and the winner is announced during Ontario Public Library Week in October.

Participate in the Evergreen Award program and register for the <u>Forest of Reading</u> today. Following a new timeline, the Evergreen Award program is the perfect program to run during a bookclub from October through until the end of the summer. The Forest of Reading consists of ten programs distinguished by age group and reading level, each with ten nominated titles. The English school-aged programs are Blue Spruce, Silver Birch Express, Silver Birch Fiction, Yellow Cedar, Red Maple, and White Pine. French literature is celebrated through the Peuplier, Mélèze, and Tamarac programs. The adult program, Evergreen, celebrates excellence in Canadian literature. There are 100 nominated titles with ten books in each program.
